Anatomy

- 1. 21.8% of students rated the syllabus as excellent, and 65.6% rated it very good.
- 2. 21.8% of students rated the relevance of the contents and objectives as excellent, 53.1% rated it very good, and 25% rated it good.
- 3. 46.8% rated the distribution of contact hours very good, and 31.2% rated it good.
- 4. 12.5% of students rated the syllabus size as excellent, 12.5% rated it very good, and 56.2% rated it good.
- 5. 37.5% rated the learning value as excellent, 50% rated it very good, and 12.5% rated it good.
- 6. 15.6% of students rated the subject's potential for extra or self-learning as excellent, 59.3% rated it very good.

Physiology

1. 28.1% of students rated the syllabus as excellent, 28.1% rated it as very good, another 28.1% rated it as good.

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- 2. 43.7% rated the relevance of the contents and objectives very good, and 46.8% rated it good.
- 3. 28.1% of students rated the distribution of contact hours as excellent and 43.7% rated it very good
- 4. 40.6% rated the syllabus size good, and 31.2% found it unsatisfactory.
- 5. 12.5% of students rated the learning value as excellent, and 75% rated it very good.
- 6. 43.7% rated the subject's potential for extra or self-learning very good, and 34.3% rated it good.
- 7. 40.6% rated the relevance of textbooks and reference books good, and 37.5% rated them very good.
- 8. 31.2% rated the subject loading in term examinations very good, 59.3% rated it good.
- 9. 40.6% rated the evaluation scheme very good, and 43.7% rated it good.

Biochemistry

- 1.31.2% of students found the syllabus good, while, 40.6%, rated it very good, and 15.6% considered it excellent.
- 2.40.6% of students felt the relevance of the contents and objectives was good, 31.2% rated it very good, and 9.3% rated it excellent.
- 3.43.7% rated the distribution of contact hours as good while 37.5% rated it very good.
- 4.40.6% found the size of syllabus good. Additionally, 37.5% rated it very good.
- 5.46.8% rated the learning value of the syllabus very good whereas 37.5% rated it good.
- 6.46.8% rated the opportunity for extra or self-learning very good, 43.7% rated it good.

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- 7.37.5% rated the relevance of textbooks and reference books very good and 25% rated them good.
- 8.53.1% rated the subject loading in term examinations good and 25% rated it very good, and 3.1% rated it excellent.

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



Students generally find the syllabus highly relevant (64.28%), indicating alignment with course expectations. The majority agree (71.42%) that the curriculum provides adequate content, with minimal neutrality (3.57%), suggesting strong content satisfaction. Learning objectives are well-communicated, as indicated by 50% strongly agreeing and 46.42% agreeing. Syllabus distribution and contact hours also receive positive feedback, with a majority agreeing on adequacy. Students are largely satisfied with syllabus completion before exams (42.85% strongly agree, 50% agree), and they perceive textbooks as available and relevant (50% strongly agree, 46.42% agree).

Kinesiology

Similar to Electrotherapy, students perceive the syllabus as relevant (64.28% strongly agree). Medicine 1

Students found the syllabus highly relevant, with 78.5% strongly agreeing. The curriculum was deemed adequate by 57.1% of students, though 14.2% remained neutral. Learning objectives were effectively communicated, with 50% strongly agreeing. The distribution of the syllabus between exams was generally accepted, though 3.57% disagreed. Contact hours and syllabus completion were mostly seen as adequate, with over 60% of students satisfied. Textbook availability was positively rated by 60.7%.

Medicine 2

The syllabus was considered relevant by 71.4% of students. The curriculum content was adequate for 57.1%, but 7.1% disagreed. Communication of learning objectives was strong, with 46.4% strongly agreeing. Syllabus distribution received positive feedback, with no significant disagreement. Contact hours and syllabus completion were generally well-received, with the majority of students expressing satisfaction. Textbooks were mostly available, though a small percentage (3.57%) found them lacking.

PSM (Preventive and Social Medicine)

The syllabus was highly relevant, with 82.1% strongly agreeing. The curriculum was adequate for most students, but 7.1% were neutral or disagreed. Learning objectives were well communicated, though 17.8% were neutral. Syllabus distribution and contact hours were seen as sufficient by the majority, and syllabus completion was largely on time. Textbook availability was positively viewed by 64.2% of students.

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Surgery 1 and 2

In both courses, the syllabus was considered relevant by over 78% of students. The curriculum content was mostly adequate, though a small percentage expressed neutrality or disagreement. Cardiorespiratory PT

Most students (70%) found the syllabus relevant, and the curriculum was generally considered adequate by 50%. However, 25% remained neutral about whether the curriculum met learning objectives. The syllabus distribution and completion before exams were well-rated, though there was a notable minority (20%) who felt contact hours were not well-distributed.

Community PT

The syllabus relevance was positively rated by 70%, but only 40% strongly agreed that the curriculum was adequate. Learning objectives were effectively communicated for most, but 15% were neutral. While syllabus distribution was mostly seen as fair, the completion rate before exams was somewhat lower, with only 30% strongly agreeing.

MSK PT (Musculoskeletal PT)

This course had a strong response, with 80% of students agreeing that the syllabus was relevant. The curriculum was seen as adequate by 60%, but some students were neutral or disagreed on communication and distribution aspects. Syllabus completion and textbook availability received mixed reviews.

As per the University's Circular and Examination Ordinance No. 01/2024, students admitted before 31st October are eligible to appear for the Summer-2024 university examination, while those admitted after 31st October are scheduled to appear in the Winter-2024 examination.

The first term for the 2023-24 B.P.Th batch commenced on 1st December 2023. Consequently, students who were admitted before 31st October 2023 had their first-year university exams conducted in June-July 2024. However, as per the communication MUHS/XP/21/4775/2024 dated 13/06/2024, the examination for the first-year B.P.Th students those admitted after 31st October (admitted batch 2023-24) is currently scheduled for Phase III, on 18th January 2025.

Given that these students' academic year began in December 2023, conducting their exams in January 2025 would extend their academic term beyond 12 months. To avoid this, I kindly request that the university examination for those admitted after 31st October 2023 be rescheduled to Phase II, in October-November 2024.

This adjustment would ensure that the students' academic year is completed within the appropriate timeframe, aligning with the university's academic regulations.

FDPS

A significant majority of respondents (72.4%) find the syllabus relevant to the course, while 62.1% agree that the curriculum meets the learning objectives. Most (65.5%) believe the learning objectives are effectively communicated, with 62.1% satisfied with the syllabus distribution between exams. However, some concerns exist, with 31% to 37.9% of students feeling neutral on these aspects, and a smaller percentage (3.4% to 10.3%) disagreeing. Additionally, 65.5% agree that the syllabus is completed on time, and 67.9% find the textbooks and references adequate, though a quarter remain neutral, and 7.1% disagree.

MEDICINE 1

A large majority of students (66.7%) believe the syllabus is relevant to the course, with 29.6% being neutral. Over half (51.9%) feel the curriculum meets the learning objectives, though 37% are neutral, and 11.1% disagree. A significant portion (59.3%) agree that the learning objectives are effectively communicated, and the syllabus is well-distributed between exams, with 40.7% neutral. Similarly, 59.3% feel contact hours are adequate, though 33.3% are neutral. Most (51.9%) agree the syllabus is completed on time, and that textbooks and references are available, while many remain neutral (44.4%).

MEDICINE 2

A significant majority of students (65.5%) believe the syllabus is relevant to the course, and 51.7% feel the curriculum adequately meets learning objectives. Most (62.1%) agree that learning objectives are effectively communicated and achieved, while 55.2% find the syllabus well-distributed between MGM Institute of Physiotherapy

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terminal and preliminary exams. The distribution of contact hours is considered adequate by 58.6%, and 51.7% of students feel the syllabus is completed before exams. Additionally, 55.2% agree that the necessary textbooks and references are available.

PSM
